

  rays of a tropical sun. Its starry sky has excited the imagination of poets and travelers. It was in this land
  that the Holy Prophet (\*) was born, in the city of Makkah, which is about fifty miles from the Red Sea.
- In the fifth and sixth centuries, mankind stood on the verge of chaos. It seemed that the civilization which had taken four thousand years to grow had started crumbling. At this point in time, Allah Almighty raised a prophet from among themselves who was to lift the humanity from their ignorance into the light of faith.

- 4. The flow of the Divine message which continued for the next twenty-three years had begun, and the Holy Prophet (#) had arisen to proclaim Oneness of God (Tauheed) and the unity of mankind. His mission was to destroy the nexus of superstition ignorance, and disbelief, set up a noble conception of life and lead mankind to the light of faith and divine bliss.
- 5. And the Holy Prophet's(\*\*) did go the way Allah Almighty had chosen for mankind. Imbued with Divine Guidance and firm resolve, the Holy Prophet(\*\*) encountered all the challenges with grace and dignity. In no time he elevated man to the highest possible level in both spiritual and worldly domains.
- 6. Such a thorough transformation of man and society owes to the Holy Prophet's (準) deep faith in Allah Almighty, to his love for humanity, and to the nobility of his character. Indeed, his life is a perfect model to follow. In reply to a question about the life of the Holy Prophet(牽), Hazart Ayesha رضى الله تعلق "His morals and character are an embodiment of the Holy Quran."
- Patriotism means love for the motherland or devotion to one's country. A patriot loves his country and is
  willing to sacrifice when the need arises. The word patriot comes from the Lain word 'patriota' which
  means countryman. It is considered a commendable quality.
- 8. Patriotism gives people the strength and courage to safeguard the interest of the country and nation. For a patriot the sovereignty, integrity and honour of the country are supreme values on which no compromise can be made. Patriots render sacrifice for the preservation and protection of these values.
- 9. The spirit of patriotism makes us stay alert in the wake of foreign invasion. In the history of Pakistan there are many instances when people laid their lives for the defense of the country. In the wars of 1965, 1971 and the Kargil War, many brave soldiers gave their lives in an attempt to protect the homeland.
- 10. There are two means of communication, electronic media and print media. The media includes films, radio, television, internet, books, magazines and newspaper. It provides us information as well as entertainment.
- 11. Yes, well said. It would not be wrong to say that media is the most vigilant institution that keeps an eye on every segment of the society. Through debates, reports and talk shows it makes everyone answerable and accountable. That is why media has become an integral part of our lives. Now, I would invite one of you to sum up the discussion.
- 12. The preparation for this journey was made at the house of Hazrat Abu Bkar Siddique (رضى الله تعالى عنها), Hazrat Asam (رضى الله تعالى عنها) rendered useful services in this regard. She prepared food for this journey. She tied the food on the camel back with her own belt as nothing else could be found. For this service she was given the title of Zaat-un-Nataqin by the Holy Prophet (ﷺ).
- 13. During the perilons journey, it was very difficult for anyone to supply food to the Prophet Muhammad (ﷺ). It was so delicate that the slightest mistake could have endangered the life of the Holy Prophet(ﷺ). This grand task was nicely undertaken by Hazrat Asma (رضى الله تعالى عنها), the daughter of Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique (رضى الله تعالىٰ عنها).
- 14. Every night, with the pack of food, she would quietly venture towards the rugged mountains in which lay the cave of Thawr. She took care of the minute detail accomplishing the task. How difficult it must been for her to traverse the rocky path at night, with the constant fear of being detected!
- 15. Her grandfather, Hazrat Abu Quhafaa was a disbeliever at that time. He was very old and had become blind. He said to her, "Asma, I think Abu Bakr has taken all the wealth, leaving you and children emptyhanded and helpless." At this, she instantly ran to a corner of the home. She gathered some pebbles and put them at the place where her father used to keep his money and jewels.



- 16. The whole journey of the great leader's struggle for a separate homeland for the Muslims of the subcontinent was based on the pivot of the Muslim unity and oneness as a nation. He talked about Pakistan in such clear terms that a common man could understand it.
- 17. "We are a nation," he affirmed three years before the birth of Pakistan, "with our own distinctive culture and civilization, language and literature, art and architecture, name and nomenclature, sense of values and proportion, legal laws and moral codes, custom and calendar, history and tradition aptitude and ambitions in short, we have our own distractive outlook on life."
- 18. Today the Quaid's Pakistan is facing numerous challenges. We have forgotten how much struggle Muslims had made under the dynamic leadership of Quaid-e-Azma Muhammad Ali Jinnah. We can overcome our present difficulties by following the Quaid's golden motto, "Paith, Unity and Discipline". We can make our nation strong by remembering his advice to the youth."
- 19. The Sultan Ahmad mosque is one of the most impressive monuments in the world. It is also known as Blue Mosque because of the blue tiles that embellish its interior. Situated in Istanbul, the largest city in Turkey and the capital of Ottoman Empire from 1453 to 1923, it has become the most popular tourist attraction.
- 20. Construction of the mosque started in 1609. The royal architect Scdefhar Mehmat Aga, was appointed by the Sultan as in-charge of the project. The opening ceremony was held in 1616. Unfortunately, the Sultan could not see the completion of the mosque in his life. It was completed in the reign of his successor Mustafa I.
- 21. Blue Mosque reflects the architectural style of both Ottoman mosque and Byzentine church. Hagia Sophia, a mosque, one of the wonders of Muslim architecture, was also kept in view as a model. Blue Mosque even today is considered unmatched in splendor, majesty and size.
- 22. The interior of the mosque at the lower level is lined with more than 20,000 hand-made ceramic tiles in more than 50 different tulip designs. At gallery level the design becomes flamboyant with representation of flowers, fruit and cypresses.
- 23. The most important element in the interior of the mosque is the mehrab, which is made of finely carved marble. To the right of the mehrab is a richly decorated pulpit. The mosque is so designed that even when it is most crowded, everyone in the mosque can hear and see the lmam.
- 24. I was upset. The advice to leave the patient unattended did not seem right. I knew that she had suffered from major neural damage, but she needed to be given a chance. An inner voice somewhere within me spoke, "Try once for her."
- 25. I was shocked to hear this. The patient's family also requested me to help them fight the case. Something needed to be done. I could not leave my patient fighting a lost battle on her own. I made up my mind to risk my career and help the patient. I requested the senior doctors to allow me to attend to this young helpless patient. Somehow, I was able to make the patient stay in the ICU.
- 26. As I stood near the bed with several questions popping in my mind, I felt a gentle pat on my shoulder. I turned around to see a young woman, smiling at me. "Are you looking for you patient?" she said and gave me a big hug. "Thank you for every think you did! I know you did not allow them to make me lead a crippled life".
- 27. I stood still, until ber family came around with big smiles on their faces. Thanks to Allah, she was my patient, standing and walking on her own feet. I could not recognize her without the machinery and tubes round her body.
- 28. She walked on crutches, which she would leave in a few months. I was so glad that I had done those exercises on her to keep her limbs in motion. I was glad that my efforts bore fruit. But most of all, I was happy that Allah Almighty had helped me win a lost battle.
- 29. She and her family had entered into a considerable bond of friendship with me. I was humbled by their sense of gratitude towards me. I felt a sense of renewed strength in me. "Where there is a will there is a way. I was proud to be a nurse.
- 30. Daug addiction is a common problem all over the world today. There are many forms of drug addiction, but the most dangerous of all is the absolute dependence on it. Long-term use of drug causes permanent mental and physical sickness. The more dangerous a substance is used the more risky it becomes. It continuous use causes total dependence on the drug.

- 32. The most important measure to be taken in this regard is the rehabilitation and recovery of a drug addict. In many countries, including Pakistan, addicts, their families and friends consider it a taboo to share their problem with others. - 33. Drug addiction is really a very serious threat to any society. In Pakistan alone, there are almost five million drug addicts. Addicts undergo numerous economic, social and health problems. The governments all over the world have been trying to eliminate drug addiction from society but still more effort are needed to completely wipe it out.
- 34. The major causes of nose pollution in Pakistan are road traffic, construction sites, careless use of electronic appliances and loud speech patterns. Noise coming from different modes of transport, i.e. vehicles, airplanes, trains, ships, proves to be highly stressful for human communities. With the population growth and development in urban areas, the vehicular traffic has also multiplied.
- 35. Use of technology is another cause of noise pollution. For example, unmonitored use of mobile phones, electricity generators, music systems and TV, all become irritants from time to time. People usually do not switch off their mobiles or put them on silent modes when they enter offices, hospitals, school and colleges.
- 36. Noise pollution causes not only environmental damage but it also has a negative impact on human health. It can cause aggression, hypertension, high stress levels, hearing loss, restlessness, depression and insomnia can further lead to anxiety, bad temper and emotional stress. In addition, noise pollution can seriously affect the learners. This gives them unnecessary mental and physical tension.
- 37. Noise pollution is a serious issue and needs more attention at local and state level. People must develop more awareness about the dangerous impact of noise on human health. It is, therefore, a need to acquire more civic sense and responsible attitude to avoid the unnecessary use of this irritant in the environment. Only then our country would be a much quieter and much more peaceful place to live in.
